In addition to his work with the Wege Foundation, he brought his vision and experience with sustainability together to establish E-Three Labs, a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that equips young people in developing communities worldwide with technical training and skills used in creating and supporting local businesses.

Jonathan is a founding member of the business council of the H. John Heinz III Center for Science, Economics and the Environment and on the Board of Nextek Power Systems, Inc. He also serves on the board of numerous nonprofit organizations including Circle of Blue, an international network focused on global water issues, and is a former board member of the Prince of Whales Trust with Cambridge University Program for Sustainable Leadership, and started GreenBlue with Bill McDonough, an institute that stimulates the creative redesign of industry.
